### 1. Financial and contractual basis of the meeting

Various options for the way in which the different societies would participate were discussed. The Netherlands Society were keen to have a financial stake in the meeting. The two Belgian Societies preferred to take no financial stake (and thus carry no financial risk).

The following format is thus proposed, but will need to be formally agreed by the governing body of each society:

- i. The contract for the meeting will be between the University of Warwick and the British Society for Parasitology. Student members of the BrSP will be able to claim travel grants to attend the meeting up to a total value of £7,000
- ii. The Netherlands Society will have a 25% stake in the meeting, i.e. they will receive 25% of any profits and will be liable for 25% of any loss. In return, Dutch students will be eligible to receive travel grants up to a total value of £3,000
- iii The two Belgian Societies will have no financial stake in the meeting and Belgian students will not be able to claim travel grants. The BeSProt offered to provide approx 20,000BF (approx £330) towards running the meeting. We suggest that this sum be used to finance the attendance of their delegate to the programme planning meeting in January (see item 5.3 below).
- iv. The total allowance for student travel grants (£10,000) will be added for the costings (budget) for the meeting. It is not anticipated that a large surplus will be made, over and above the £10,000 to be used for travel grants.

Action: All society representatives must put the above proposal to the governing body of their Society and send written confirmation of the conditions of participation by their Society to Dr Eleanor Riley by July 1st 1998.

### 4. Budget

Warwick University costs its conferences as follows:

- 1. All delegates are charged a "facility fee" which includes use of all the University facilities (including room hire for the lecture theatres and the exhibition space, audio visual aids and technician time, free access to bars, restaurants, car parking and sports centre/swimming pool etc). The fee includes 6 full time conference assistants who will be available for manning registration desks, as projectionists etc. This facility fee is currently £5 per person per day.
- 2. Catering and accommodation is costed at a "24 hour rate" which includes bed, breakfast, self service lunch, self service dinner, tea and coffee breaks. The 1999 charges for this will be £47.75 per day for standard rooms and £62.75 per day for ensuite rooms. A day rate (facility fee plus lunch, tea, coffee and dinner) is available for those who do not want accommodation. Accommodation will be available on Saturday night for those travelling from overseas who want to take advantage of reduced air fares; this will be charged at the B&B rate of £28 standard, £40.00 ensuite.
- 3. As delegates will have paid the equivalent of £8.75 for self service dinner on Tuesday night, the additional charge for those wishing to attend the **conference dinner will be** £8.50 (plus wines etc). It is proposed that delegates be charged £20.00 per head, to include a reception (2 drinks per head), wine (half bottle per head), flowers etc.
- 4. The following additional charges will be levied:

Administration/registration package £ 15.00 per head\*

Poster boards £ 8.50 per board per day

Clip-on microphones (1 needed) £ 35.00 per day
Late license applications (x 3) £ 35.00 each

Ceilidh band - to be negotiated but expected to be approx £ 600 Room hire for Ceilidh (if the dining room cannot be used) £ 400

### 5. Procedures for abstracts and registration

#### 1. Abstracts:

Abstracts will be handled by email. Frank Nowell will not be preparing the abstract booklet - he has retired from this onerous responsibility! GM suggested that Warwick Univ Press may be prepared to do all the formatting and put the abstracts into order and that the cost may be minimal if they get the contract for printing. *Action: GM* 

Abstract forms will be available by September 1998.

The form will also be available on the BrSP web page. *Action: Jeremy Sternberg* The deadline for abstract submission will be December 18th 1998.

# 2. Registration forms:

The registration form will be produced by GM ready for the summer meeting of BrSP Council. *Action: GM.* This will allow the form to be printed (3 sheets, no carbon) and ready for distribution in September. This will allow the abstract and registration forms to be distributed together and minimise on the work load for the Dutch and Belgian Societies. It will also avoid the problem of registration forms going out late if the BrSP mailing is delayed for any reason.

Registration forms will only be accepted if accompanied by payment. Payment by credit card will be available. The deadline for registration will be March 8th, 1999.

Reduced registration will be available for student members of all 4 societies. Applications for reduced registration must be accompanied by proof of student status and a letter from the academic supervisor.

### 3. Programme:

A draft programme will be available by September, to be circulated with the abstract forms and registration forms. It will include details of invited speakers and plenary lecturer etc.

#### Action: EMR

The final programme will be compiled from submitted abstracts. A programme meeting will be held in London (London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine) in mid-January. Those attending will be ER, GM and one person from each of the other societies. NSP suggested M. Yazdanbakhsh; other delegates to be identified by the Belgian societies. The final programme will be available mid-February and will be mailed to members of all societies and be posted on the BrSP web page.

Action: EMR, JS; All societies to identify person to attend meeting in London in January

#### 6. Travel arrangements:

The Dutch and Belgian Societies may wish to try and arrange group travel to reduce travelling costs. This may include hiring of buses to take people to and from Birmingham airport. These arrangements must be self financing and are the responsibility of individual societies. **GM** may be able to assist with arrangements at the UK end.

### 7. Publication:

The possibility of publishing papers from invited speakers and/or abstracts was discussed. The BeSP has a society ISBN number and Dr Govaerts expressed some interest in collating a publication. This aspect of the meeting needs to be discussed by all 4 societies before any decision can be made.

Action: All societies to give opinions on publication to ER by July 1st 1998.
